What's *Children's Day*? A forgotten holiday. Today, only a few churches, denominations, and individuals celebrate the day. But still, *Children's Day* observations in the United States predate both Mother's and Father's Day. This day dates from the 1880s and earlier. Massachusetts has legislation mandating a proclamation. In early May, the Illinois House passed a resolution, HR1158, declaring June 11, 2006 (the second Sunday in June) as *Children's Day*.

John Ross, an advocate for a national *Children's Day*, feels "that now more than ever, children need a special day. I'm hopeful that individuals, churches, denominations, media, businesses, government, and organizations can help spread the support for a national *Children's Day* on the second Sunday in June."
