on Wednesday issued a proclamation. The Illinois cities of Batavia and Aurora (Illinois' second largest city) have issued mayoral proclamations.

The website <a href="www.nationalchildrensday.us">www.nationalchildrensday.us</a>, supporting the revival of "Children's Day" on the second Sunday in June (this year June 10, 2007), is stressing this day as a day of celebration and commitment by parent and individuals to children.

John Ross, advocate for "Children's Day" and part of a growing movement spear-headed by the website <a href="www.nationalchildrensday.us">www.nationalchildrensday.us</a>, expressed gratitude to the Illinois governor and local public officials. "I just can't express my deep happiness for the support of Illinois Governor Rod Blagojevich in proclaiming this day. The "*Children's Day*" website offers helps and challenges parents, individuals, churches/houses of worship, schools/places of education, government/community and businesses to sign commitment cards directed at affirming America's children. They pledge to "commit myself(ourself), in the coming year, to love, cherish, nurture(physical, mental, emotional, & spiritual needs), and affirm..." They can also make a commitment beyond America to the world's children.

"Children's Day" observations in the United States predate both Mother's and Father's Day. This day dates from the 1880s and earlier. The General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in 1883 designated the "the second Sabbath in June as Children's Day."

Chase's Calendar of Events cites Children's Sunday.

Numerous churches and denominations observe the day including the African Methodist Episcopal Church and the Church of the Nazarene.

Last year, the Illinois House passed a resolution proclaiming the day. The *Chicago Tribune* also ran an article.

This year, Dr. Paul Cedar of the *Mission America Coalition* was promised to spread the word to his community of influence. A few weeks ago, Moody radio's "*Prime Time Chicago*" did an interview.

On Sunday, June 10, *CBS Radio News* will air an interview with advocate John Ross.
